












Welcome to the 2023 Alexandria Film Festival!

This festival is not possible without you, and we thank you for sharing your passion for independent films with us.


We also thank our very generous sponsors and loyal volunteers who literally make the festival happen every year. Unfortunately, not all businesses support the arts, so please patronize those that do.






